Internet policy in Latin America: Between borderless governance and national initiatives

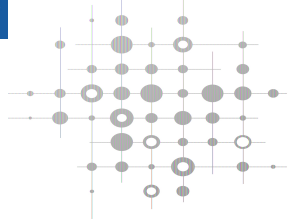

This seminar looks at the challenges for addressing Internet governance with national policy instruments and institutions. There are increased efforts to localize the Internet governance regime, both from legislatures and in courts. At the same time, the international regime is in transition towards greater institutionalization and away from its U.S. roots. In addition the stakes are much higher after the revelations of widespread surveillance by security agencies. Today, Internet governance debates reach the highest policy levels and are prominently covered by the general media. These changes raise several

questions. What are the regulatory and institutional building blocks for current debates? How are domestic debates articulating with global policy discussions and its institutions? Which stakeholders are being represented and how? What are the mechanisms for policy coordination within Latin America? Have the mechanisms for policy coordination between the national, regional and international spheres been effective? How to protect national jurisdiction while avoiding Internet fragmentation?
